<p>Junior Year Fall</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Investigate different areas of law and legal careers • Browse/research programs and law schools (for a list of ABA approved U.S. Law Schools: www.lsac.org)
<p>Late Winter/ Spring</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Register in March to take the June LSAT (recommended, but available additional dates) • Continue LSAT preparation and take practice tests • Practice tests at www.learningexpresslibrary.com. • Create a list of faculty members that you would like to ask to write you recommendation letters
<p>Summer</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take the LSAT in June • Subscribe to the LSDAS (Law School Data Assembly Service). Details on the LSDAS subscription are available through the Law Schools Admission Council. • Have your transcripts sent to LSDAS • Request information and visit law schools • Create a list of law schools that you plan to apply to • Check for specific deadlines and application requirements • Begin development of your application materials • Register for October LSAT if you did not take it in June or earlier
<p>Senior Year Fall</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create an account with LSAC and complete application • Take October LSAT, if needed • Have application materials reviewed by a CE&D staff member • Ask for letters of recommendation • Request financial aid information • Complete LSDAS report • Finalize and send in completed applications
<p>Winter (January)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Send in updated transcripts to LSDAS and law schools you applied to • Prepare for interviews • Submit financial aid forms
<p>Spring</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Evaluate offers of acceptance and financial aid • Submit acceptance letters to law school of your choice • Share where you have been accepted and future plans with faculty and CE&D staff!
