I am writing to share with you a very exciting opportunity for graduating seniors. As President of the Global Corporate College, a network of 25 colleges in the U.S. committed to closing our Nation's talent gap, and as the President of Cuyahoga Community College's Corporate College, I have recently been asked to develop a program that would provide 100 English teachers for China beginning Fall 2008. This is a very exciting opportunity for many of our graduating seniors to gain international teaching experience and to expand their global horizons.

The Program would provide each graduate with:

Training to teach English Language Dialogue

- Training on being an ambassador for the State of Ohio
- All U.S. paperwork processing
- U.S. approved placement site in China
- Round trip transportation to China
- 700-900 U.S. dollars monthly stipend, depending on assignment
- International campus housing
- One month paid vacation
- Health insurance benefits
- China work visa

We are asking you to assist us in identifying students to engage in this exciting opportunity.

Applicants must be in good standing with your institution, be a graduate by June 2008, be able to pass a criminal background check, be willing to live in China for one year, and have the spirit of exploration required to engage in an international cultural opportunity.

Each applicant's résumé will be screened and either a telephone or face-to-face interview will be conducted. The résumés of selected candidates will be presented to program directors in China who will make the final selection of teachers.

Selected candidates must participate in short term (mid-June to mid-July) specialized training for the project that will be conducted by Global Corporate College. They will travel to China in August and teach in China for one year, with the potential to extend their contract for a second year if desired. Candidates must also ensure their eligibility, including necessary medical requirements, for a Chinese visa.

Teachers will work between 6-18 hours per week, excluding preparatory time, but are then free to join other language classes, cultural classes, or work with other students or faculty to learn Chinese.
