

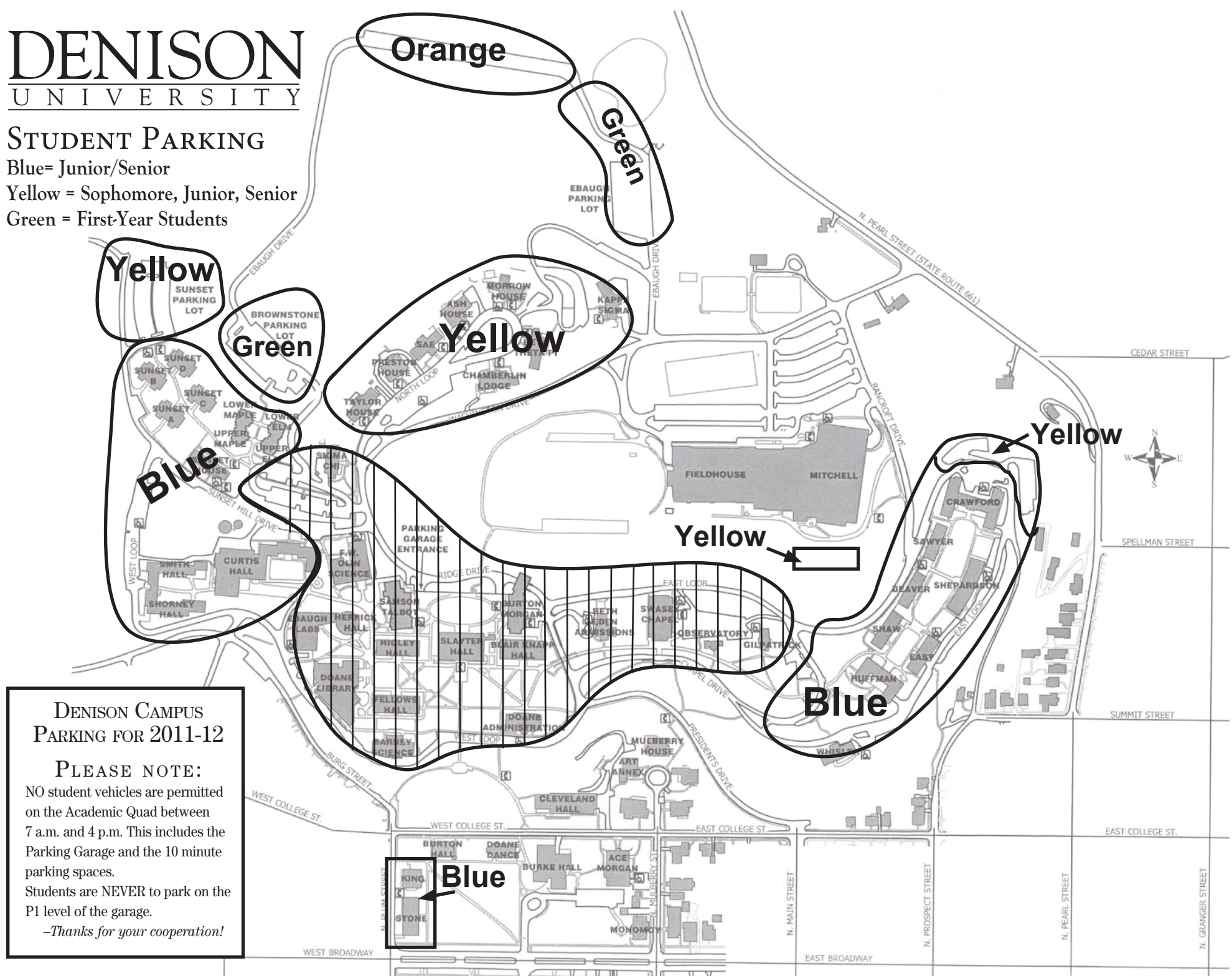

## SUMMARY OF MOTOR VEHICLE REGULATIONS 2011-2012

### SEE PARKING MAP ON THE REVERSE SIDE

- All student parking areas indicated on this map correspond with color coded parking permits and signs in lots.
- **Seniors and juniors may park in any in any student parking space. Sophomores may park in yellow or green parking area. First Year Students must park in green lots at all times (7 days/week).**
- **No student vehicles permitted on the Academic Quad between 7 AM and 4 PM weekdays; this includes: 10-minute spaces, Olin and Swasey. Students are never to park on the P1 level of the Parking Garage.**
- Seniors, juniors and sophomores are permitted to park on the Academic Quad between 4 PM and 7 AM on weekdays and all day on weekends; including the lower levels of the Parking Garage. First Year Students are not permitted to park on the Academic Quad at any time (this includes the Parking Garage).
- **Weekday parking regulations apply on holidays.**
- There is no student parking in front of Mitchell or the Field House.

A Denison registration sticker is not only a parking permit, but is required for roadway use of a motor vehicle. Cars, motorcycles, mopeds, vans, trucks, and all other motor vehicles must be registered with the University through the Student Accounts Office; the fee is \$75/yr. for blue, yellow or green permits. A registration permit must be placed on the vehicle (motorcycle, etc.) within 72 hours of physically locating the vehicle on campus or a No Visible Registration citation will be issued. Registration permits must be displayed on the rear bumper or rear window (driver's side) of the car or on the fender of your motorcycle or moped. Parking Permits remain the property of Denison University.

<b>Parking in a Fire Lane, near a Fire Hydrant, or in designated Fire Dept. space for any length of time:</b> strictly prohibited, as it creates serious safety hazards. <b>This violation may not be appealed.</b>	\$100, plus towing	<b>Failure to stop</b> for an officer or <b>leaving the scene of an accident.</b> If you are involved in any type of traffic accident on campus, <u>do not</u> leave the scene. Contact Security and file a report.	\$100, plus judicial action
<b>No Visible Registration</b> (fine is canceled if vehicle is registered within 24 hours of citing; payment of this fine does not register your vehicle)	<b>\$100</b>	<b>DUI or Open Container</b>	\$100, plus judicial action, and reported to the Granville Police Department

**In cases of speeding, reckless operation, stop sign violation and DUI, the driver is held responsible. Responsibility for all other violations rests with the individual in whose name the vehicle is registered in.**

**If you are involved in any type of accident on campus, do not leave the scene of the accident. Contact Security and file a report.**

Campus Security and Safety will use the auto-boot immobilizer in the following situations:

1. To impound a vehicle pertaining to an investigation (to preserve evidence) or to disable a vehicle so it cannot be moved before a wrecker arrives (i.e., accident).
2. When the vehicle/license plate number appears on the multiple offenders list or other instances, when deemed necessary by Campus Security and Safety Officer.

Any vehicle, which inhibits the flow of traffic, parks in a fire lane, a fire department space or in a handicapped space while unauthorized to do so will be towed immediately. Vehicles owned by repeat offenders, and vehicles owned by individuals denied parking privileges are subject to towing. Vehicles may be towed for other reasons deemed necessary by the Director of Campus Security, Safety & Risk Management.

- Temporary parking permits will cost \$10 and are limited to a maximum length of 21 days. Vehicles with temporary parking permits are to be parked in the green parking area (First Year Parking).
- If a student receives a citation, he/she has 7 days from the date the citation was issued to file a written appeal. Fines will be posted to student accounts immediately. **Students receiving 5 or more citations in an academic year will lose their parking privileges for the remainder of the academic year.** *Fire lane and handicapped violations cannot be appealed.*
- The campus wide speed limit is 20mph.
- Commuters will park in the area in which their permit allows (green, yellow or blue).
