Once I began to compile the Guide, the Human Resources Office asked that the information be made available on their web page for all potential employees of the University. The purpose of this guide is to help everyone considering employment at Denison find out more about the diversity in our community.

In 2006, the general faculty of Denison University passed a resolution on the importance of diversity in the pursuit of a liberal education. In part, that statement says, “Denison is committed to the idea that our community should include people from a wide variety of religious, cultural, ethnic, racial, gender, sexual orientation and socio-economic backgrounds in order to realize the goals of a liberal arts education.
