PROGRAM NOTES

Graduates are listed alphabetically under the degree they are receiving, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts. In some cases, a student may earn more than one bachelor's degree during his or her undergraduate years. The student's major(s) are listed to the right of his or her name, with a concentration indicated within parentheses. Directly below each name is the student's home town. Senior Honors Projects titles appear in italics underneath the home town, along with the name and terminal degree of the faculty supervisor(s).

President's Medalists wear gold medals awarded to them in recognition of their status. Students graduating as members of the Honors Program wear bronze medals. Students designated in this program as graduates of the Honors Program have achieved a 3.4 grade point average by the end of the sophomore year and maintained it through their senior year, have taken at least four Honors seminars during their Denison career and have completed an Honors project. Student members of Mortar Board, a national honor society that recognizes college seniors for their achievements in scholarship, leadership and service, wear gold tassels on their caps.

Music for the program was coordinated by the Department of Music. Today's processions are selections chosen from *The Water Music* (1717) and *Music for the Royal Fireworks* (1749) by George Frideric Handel (1685-1759). *A Knobel Fanfare* by Associate Professor of Music Andrew Glendening is based on the letters of President Knobel's first and last names. *Community: A Fanfare for the Class of 2004* is an original composition by Assistant Professor of Music Ching-chu Hu. Musical selections are being performed by Daniel Strawser '06, cello; Christopher Dougherty '05 and Carl McCoy '07, violins; Abigail Bacon '05, viola; Professors Andrew Glendening (Music) and Thomas Evans (Chemistry), trombones; Assistant Professor Nicolas del Grazia, percussion; Ben Huntoon and

Daniel King, trumpets. The group is conducted by Assistant Professor of Music Andrew Carlson. The Chapel bell ringer is Abbey Valvano '06. The Denison Chamber Singers are directed by Instructor of Music Stephen Caracciolo.

The program concludes when the platform party and faculty have recessed. The audience and graduates are asked to remain seated during the recessional. In the event that Commencement exercises are held in Mitchell Recreation and Athletics Center, the graduates will also recess.

Parents or friends taking pictures of graduates receiving diplomas are asked to use the special section designated for this purpose.

Flowers for the Commencement activities were designed by the Village Flower Basket, Granville, Ohio. Interpretive signing is being provided through Hallenross & Associates.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The academic costume which makes the Commencement procession so colorful is more than 800 years old, dating back to the days when students were “clerks,” (members of the minor clergy) and wore monkish gowns and hoods. In those days of unheated classrooms and garret sleeping quarters, the hoods were used to keep the wearers warm. The “tippet” on the end of the hood could also be used as a convenient pocket. Today, the hood is used only as an ornament.

Both the gown and the hood indicate the degree held by the wearer, or the degree about to be received. The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves and no trimming. The master's gown also has pointed sleeves but they are slit at the elbow; it also is untrimmed. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves adorned with chevrons and is faced down the front with velvet. Graduates of some institutions wear gowns in the color(s) of the university that awarded their degrees.

RETIRING FACULTY

JON ROGERS FARRIS

Jonathan R. Reynolds Distinguished Professor and Professor Emeritus of Theatre

All the world is a stage and when Professor of Theatre Jon Farris speaks, whether he is in a classroom, on the boards in *Ace Morgan* or even on a putting green, his language and the inflections in his voice reveal him as an actor. Since 1981, the year he joined the Denison faculty as associate professor and chair of the Department of Theatre and Cinema, he has taught thousands of students about the subtleties of the English language and how to take words off a page and use them melodically. He was promoted to professor in 1986 and became the first recipient of the Jonathan R. Reynolds Distinguished Professorship in Theatre in 1994.

Farris began acting in high school in West Lafayette, Ind., and chose Harding University (Searcy, Ark.) to continue his high school football career. A broken arm during his freshman year cut short his athletic aspirations, but opened up new possibilities for him as he did therapy on damaged nerves in his arm by learning to play the guitar and banjo. He completed a B.A. with a major in English and speech and went on to the University of Wisconsin where he earned a master's degree in theatre in 1967. While there he toured with the Wisconsin Idea Theatre telling the history of the state through folklore and folk music, playing the banjo and singing. He completed a Ph.D. in dramatic literature at Tufts University in 1970 and taught acting and directing at Case Western Reserve University, University of Massachusetts, Indiana

University and Dartmouth College before coming to Denison where he has been committed to teaching students the value of a liberal education. Over the years Farris has toughened the requirements for majors and attracted a group of students who were willing to work hard to achieve the kind of theatre productions he demands. Currently about 50 students are theatre majors and the department has grown to five faculty.

Along with directing more than 20 productions at Denison, Farris has appeared here in "Candide," "Poor Murderer," "The Wedding Feast," "Taking Sides," and two plays by prominent playwright Donald Freed, "Secret Honor" and most recently, "Ivan Ilych." Farris also has performed at the Utah Shakespearean Festival, Indiana Repertory Theatre, Illinois Shakespeare Festival, Cleveland Play House, Cincinnati Playhouse and TheatreWorks in Connecticut. He also has performed "Nixon's Nixon" at Contemporary American Theatre Company in Columbus, along with "Sleuth," "The Importance of Being Earnest" and "A Tuna Christmas." He played the title role in "King Lear" for Ohio State University's Theatre Department.

Farris plans to do "a lot of acting" in the future, but reflects, "I think this probably has been the best job in the country for me. I had enough need to be a teacher that I would not have been happy only being an actor."

JOAN M. NOVAK

Associate Professor Emerita of Religion and Women's Studies

As faculty members retire from years of service to Denison, most of them are feted and sure to be sorely missed by the department in which they have served for many years. In Joan Novak's case, she has shared her talents with the departments of Religion and Women's Studies and has played a pivotal role in building the ethics programs in those areas. And she treasures the warm relationship she has shared with both departments.

Professor Novak joined Denison's faculty in 1979 as an assistant professor in the Religion department, after having taught at Merrimack College (N. Andover, Mass.) and Concordia College (Moorhead, Minn.) She earned a bachelor of science degree with honors and distinction in zoology and chemistry from the University of Nebraska in 1965, and completed a doctorate at the University of Iowa in 1976 with the dissertation "Science: Dilemma and Opportunity for Christian Ethics, Jacob Bronowski, a case study."

She has continued to do research on bioethics and medical ethics, AIDS, feminist theology and spirituality, particularly relating to the formulation of Christian symbols, during her teaching career. According to Religion Department Chair David Woodyard, her introductory course "Ethics, Society and the Moral Self," along with courses in institutional ethics, biomedical ethics and Christian ethics, broadened the base of courses offered and helped to grow the Religion department from three majors a year

in 1979 to between 15 and 20 today. In 1980, with the inclusion of Minority/Women's Studies as part of the graduation requirement, Novak assumed an active role in the Women's Studies department as well, teaching her students to be self-critical, to analyze, to do independent thinking and reasoning rather than relying on institutions to do that for them. She was named associate professor in 1985.

Professor Novak also has devoted herself to service to the college community and has served on the University, Academic Affairs and Judicial Councils as well as the Personnel Committee and as adviser to the Phi Society. Her concern with social justice issues has led her to be a long-time supporter of student special interest organizations such as Rape Survivor Advocates and Outlook. She has incorporated issues of race, class and gender both in her academic work and in the life of the Denison community.

Her years of teaching and learning will not end with her retirement, for she has already planned to take a course in astronomy here next year as well as to do volunteer work in tutoring reading and in the field of medical ethics. She plans to put aside enough hours to retrain for another 100-mile-a-day "century ride" on her bike – a feat she accomplished a few years ago – and to spend some quality time spoiling her two cats, Gabriel Michael Mandela and Miriam Mary Marie.

R. ELLIOTT STOUT
Professor Emeritus of Cinema

Elliott Stout admits to having some showmanship in his genes and a lifelong love affair with the movies. What better combination for a revered professor of cinema who has thrived on building a fledgling department into a robust and respected one and developing a following of devoted alumni who are his former students?

Professor Stout joined Denison's faculty in 1966 as assistant professor of Theatre Arts. He was named associate professor in 1976 and professor in 1980. A native of Columbus, Ohio, he is a graduate of the Columbus Academy and earned bachelor's (1962), master's (1963) and doctoral (1966) degrees from Ohio State University.

By 1971, with the encouragement of Professor of Theatre Emeritus Bill Brasmer, Stout helped to launch the cinema major and Denison had a new department of Theatre and Cinema. Soon after his arrival, Stout was instrumental in founding the Denison Film Society, a student group that screened and funded films for study. Without studio facilities, students went out into the field to film and then used the dark rooms of Ace Morgan Theatre (Stout called it "Deuce" Morgan) for their editing and production. In 1977, they got a home of their own in the Cinema Annex on Mulberry Street. Cinema became an independent department in 1998 and today has three full-time faculty members and 68 majors, most of whom came to Denison specifically for the major. All the courses in the department are filled to capacity, according

to Associate Professor of Cinema David Bussan '81, a former student of Stout's, who now chairs the department.

Stout's classes such as Myth and Fantasy in Cinema, Masters of the Cinema and World Cinema played to full houses, attracting more than 200 students a semester from a variety of majors who awaited his familiar greeting, "Good afternoon, Denisonians," and the fascinating material that would follow. Traveling with Stout for 31 glorious days of theatre in London during January Term was a learning experience for students and professor as well. During the mid-1980s, Stout gained additional hands-on film making expertise producing promotional films for the Turkish Ministry of Tourism. During the ensuing years, numerous students accompanied him to the Turkish Republic in Northern Cyprus for January and May Term travel seminars such as "The Antiquities of Cyprus" to work on documentary films. He says, "As a teacher and role model in cinema and its production, I am pleased with the number of graduates who have made a difference not only in cinema, but also in other fields, based on the inspiration they found downhill."

An authority on Alfred Hitchcock and film noir, Stout was also a masterful table tennis player and took pardonable pleasure in teaching many of his students the finer arts of the game as he defeated them soundly. His retirement will give him time to organize Denison's film archive and to pursue his 42-year romance with wife Ann.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

MICHAEL H. ARMACOST

Doctor of Laws, honoris causa

Michael H. Armacost, an internationally recognized scholar and leader in the formulation of U.S. policy in East Asia, has been a Shorenstein Distinguished Fellow in the Asia/Pacific Research Center, Institute of International Studies of Stanford University since 2002. He was also at the Center from 1993 to 1995 as a Distinguished Senior Fellow and visiting professor.

Dr. Armacost served as president of the Brookings Institution, the nation's oldest think tank, in Washington, D.C., from 1995 until 2002, and was a leader in research on politics, government, international affairs, economics and public policy. During a distinguished 24-year career in government, he served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian and Pacific Affairs and Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs (1984-1989). As Ambassador to the Philippines under President Ronald Reagan (1982-1984), he was a key force in helping that country undergo a nonviolent transition to democracy. In 1989, President George H. Bush appointed him Ambassador to Japan, a post that was considered one of the most important and sensitive U.S. diplomatic assignments abroad. He served in that capacity until 1993. He also held senior policy responsibilities in the National Security Council and Department of Defense.

A native of Ohio, Dr. Armacost was educated at Carleton College, Friedrich Wilhelms University and Columbia University where he earned master's and doctoral degrees in public law and government. He began his career in academia as a professor of government at Pomona College. In 1969, he was awarded a White

House Fellowship and was assigned to the secretary and deputy secretary of state. Following a stint on the State Department policy planning and coordination staff, he became a special assistant to the U.S. Ambassador to Tokyo from 1972-1974, his first foreign diplomatic post.

Dr. Armacost also has taught and lectured at Georgetown University, Johns Hopkins University and International Christian University. He is the author of three books, the most recent of which, *Friends or Rivals?*, was published in 1996 and draws on his experience as Ambassador to Japan. Among his publications by the Stanford Institute for International Studies are *Addressing the North Korea Nuclear Challenge* (2003) and *A United States Policy for the Changing Realities of East Asia: Toward a New Consensus* (1996).

He was the recipient of the President's Distinguished Service Award (1987 and 1989), the Defense Department's Distinguished Civilian Service Award (1980) and the Secretary of State's Distinguished Service Award (1988) in recognition of his contributions as a specialist in East Asian affairs.

Dr. Armacost is a board member of Carleton College, the Asia Foundation, the American Academy of Diplomacy and a director of AFLAC, Applied Materials and Cargill. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations, the Trilateral Commission and the National Academy of Public Administration.

Dr. Armacost and his wife Roberta are the parents of three grown sons and six grandchildren.

PAMELA LYNNE HOUSTON '83

Doctor of Humane Letters, honoris causa

Pam Houston is a prolific, successful and critically acclaimed author who graduated summa cum laude from Denison in 1983 with a bachelor of arts degree in English. Her books include the best-selling *Cowboys are My Weakness* (W.W. Norton, 1992) that was the winner of the 1993 Western States Book Award and has been translated into nine languages; *Waltzing the Cat* (W.W. Norton, 1998) that won the Willa Award for Contemporary Fiction, and her first novel, *Sighthound*, completed in 2003. She also has published a collection of autobiographical essays *A Little More About Me* (W.W. Norton, 1999) and a collaboratively written historical book *Tomboy Bride: A Woman's Personal Account of Life in Mining Camps of the West* (1997).

Houston edited a collection of essays, fiction and poetry called *Women on Hunting* (Ecco Press, 1994) and wrote the text for a book of photographs by Veronique Vial, *Men Before Ten A.M.* (Beyond Words, 1996). Her stories have been selected for the 1999 volumes of Best American Short Stories, the O. Henry Awards, and the Pushcart Prize. Houston's *The Best Girlfriend You Never Had* was John Updike's only addition to Best American Short Stories of the Century when that volume went from hard cover to paperback in 1999.

Her stories have appeared in *Mirabella*, *Mademoiselle* and the *Mississippi Review*. Her nonfiction work has appeared in *The New York Times*, *Elle*, *Vogue*, *Travel and Leisure*, *Ski*, *Los Angeles Magazine*, and *Food and Wine*.

After graduating from Denison, Houston rode across Canada on a bicycle, through Oregon to Colorado, where she worked in various jobs including being a bartender and flag woman on a highway crew. She eventually earned a master's degree from the University of Utah (1992) and then spent a year as an instructor in Denison's English department. She currently is director of the Creative Writing Program at the University of California, Davis, where she is a professor of English. She also teaches at summer writers' conferences and festivals in the United States and abroad. Houston occasionally appears on CBS-TV Sunday Morning doing literary essays on the wilderness. She is a licensed river guide and a horsewoman and when school is not in session, lives in southwestern Colorado at 9,000 feet above sea level near the headwaters of the Rio Grande River.

In the 1993 summer issue of Denison Magazine, Houston shared her thoughts about writing. She said, "I write for the sheer love of language, to watch the words crash into each other on the page, to watch the spark of electricity between them as they sit together, the rowdy unpredictable job of language play. I write because I know there's nothing better than a good story, well told, because I know that we rework, relive and re-create our lives through our stories, that in the end our lives are nothing more than the stories we've collected, the tales we remember about each other and ourselves."

JOHN R. MEYER '67
Doctor of Social Sciences, honoris causa

During the past 13 and one-half years, Jack Meyer has served as president and CEO of Harvard Management Co. Inc., (HMC), a nonprofit subsidiary of Harvard University that manages its endowment portfolio and is based in Cambridge, Mass. During that period he has grown the endowment from \$5.1 billion in September 1990 to nearly \$19.3 billion at the end of June 2003, giving Harvard the largest endowment of any university in the United States. Meyer justifiably has been called a gifted investment strategist and an adept manager, as well as the “Ty Cobb of funds management.”

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Meyer graduated from Denison in 1967 with a Bachelor of Science degree in psychology. He continued his education at Harvard Business School, entering as one of the youngest members of his class and, according to his recollections, too intimidated to speak up in class for the first six months. He was awarded an M.B.A. in 1969, and for the following three years was a security analyst and investment officer with Brown Brothers Harriman, a private bank in New York City. From 1973 to 1979, Meyer was associated with Lionel D. Edie, an investment counseling firm in New York City, working in the research department initially and then in portfolio management beginning in 1975. He was named chief portfolio officer in 1977. He next became deputy controller of New York City, managing the city’s pension funds, sinking funds and treasury funds – about \$20 billion in total – until 1983.

In that year he was named treasurer and chief investment officer of the Rockefeller Foundation, responsible for the management of the foundation’s endowment of \$2.1 billion. He served in that capacity until joining HMC in 1990.

With a staff of 120, HMC manages Harvard’s endowment assets, pension funds and the charitable trusts and pooled income funds generated by planned gifts. With a 12.5% return on its endowment investments for fiscal 2003, Harvard’s gain was not only one of the highest among colleges in the United States, but also among large financial funds generally. According to Meyer, Harvard kept a diversified portfolio with about 22 percent bond (domestic, foreign and inflation-indexed), 43 percent equities (domestic, foreign, emerging markets and private) and the remainder in commodities, real estate and investments chosen for their absolute return or high yield.

The endowment provides long-term fiscal stability for student financial aid, the faculty and academic programs. Much of Meyer’s success is credited to his ability to attract and retain highly talented and successful portfolio managers and staff to HMC, as well as his use of a policy portfolio benchmark structure to guide investment policy.

He and his wife Elizabeth, who is a former researcher and reporter for Time Magazine, are the parents of Justus and Halsey, both of whom are students at Harvard. Meyer’s sister Gail ’63 and brother Richard ’71 are also graduates of Denison. Gail and her husband Greg Gibson are in the audience today.
