1. Divisional Requirements

A department may only be used one time to fulfill as divisional requirement. Sometime during a student's first year experience a section of FYS 102 or a Honors course must be selected as one of the divisional requirements or the Interdisciplinary and World issues requirement.

Fine Arts Divisional Requirements (2)	Appropriate courses from Art Studio*, Art History*, Cinema, Dance, Music, and Theatre are used to fulfill this requirement. <small>Students may also fulfill one fine arts requirement with a collection of activity credits from the same department and category (e.g. four semester of private music lessons or four semester of music ensemble, or four credit hours of dance technique or four hours of theatre workshop.) *Either a Studio Art or Art History course constitutes the selection from the Department of Art.</small>	1. _____	_____	_____	_____

Humanities Divisional Requirements (2)	Appropriate courses from Classics, English, History, Modern Languages, Philosophy, and Religion are used to fulfill these requirements. <small>All courses in Classics, Latin, and Greek count under the Department of Classics. Science Divisional Requirements (2)	Appropriate courses from Biology, Chemistry & Biochemistry, Geology/Geography, Mathematics & Computer Science, Physics & Astronomy, and Psychology are used to fulfill these requirements. <small>Note well that several departments in the sciences may have listings under different disciplines. All courses in Astronomy and all in Physics fall under one department. The same is true for Geology & Geography, and Mathematics & Computer Science.
