General Information

The procedure for pre-registration during this Spring will have many aspects similar to those used for past semesters. You need carefully to consider needs in your major, general education possibilities, pre-requisites, and hierarchical structures of some programs.

- A. Be sure to use the 5 digit CRN (course registration number) whenever you identify a course you are wishing to add or drop.
- B. Current registration figures can always be reviewed on the Registrar's data base. Sometimes there is a slight delay before the figures are refreshed and your ability to access information on the web or myDenison may be turned off while schedule processing is being done. Please be aware that some courses could appear to have both openings and a waitlist. This occurs when some students have requested a course but may not have met all pre-requisites. Also some courses accept a limited number of students from various classes; in such situations the openings that are being shown are to be assigned only to students that are part of that unique population. If a course has pre requisites that you have failed to complete you will likely be excluded from the course. Sometimes this step will occur by the faculty member after the course has begun. Do be careful about checking your eligibility.
- C. If your MYDENISON account has been activated, you can review your schedule online. Check carefully if you are registered for the course or waitlisted for the course. You must check the **Student Detail** screen not just the **Student Schedule** screen. The actual results of the pre registration process are shown on the Student Detail screen.
- D. All registration schedule cards and add/drop forms used for schedule adjustments must be signed by the academic advisor. Beginning on the first day of the term the instructor's signature is required in addition to the advisor on all add/drop forms.

Advising and Enrollment Instructions

- A. Study the course offerings and in consultation with your advisor plan a program of courses for the Spring Semester 2009-2010, which will meet your needs and objectives.
- B. Students should not expect schedule requests of more than 18 hours to be processed unless a written explanation is filed in the Registrar's Office by the advisor. A special area on the enrollment card has been set aside for the advisor to indicate his or her approval. A nineteen hour schedule already would result in an excess hour charge for the semester of \$1,115.
- C. Check if you are meeting:
 - 1. General education requirements for graduation. Summary information is available in the catalog and on Page 2 in this class schedule.
 - 2. Requirements for the departmental major or minor.
 - 3. Requirements for admission to graduate or professional school, or for other post- Denison plans.
- D. Complete the enrollment card neatly. For the computer terminal operator to process your card properly it is imperative that it is completed with care as to legibility and accuracy. *DO NOT EXPECT THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE TO FILL IN MISSING INFORMATION!*
 - 1. CRN number
 - 2. Discipline of Study --> Do not use course title; if taking a foreign language identify clearly which language.
 - 3. Course number
 - 4. Section number - Each course has a section number that makes the particular offering unique
 - 5. Exam letter
 - 6. Hour and day of meeting
 - 7. Any course requiring consent must bear the signature of the instructor.
- E. On the enrollment card Item B allows each student to indicate his/her preference about being placed into an open section of a course when the original selection has been filled. The Registrar's Office will automatically proceed with this option if left blank or if we feel we can help students. First year students and sophomores should always expect the Registrar's Office to apply this option regardless of indication. Departments may request that students be moved from one section to another if it is necessary in order to meet the demand for certain required courses.
- F. The bottom portion of the card enables all students to list alternatives if first choices are closed. We suggest you use this space to indicate different courses and not just different sections of first choices. The Registrar's Office will turn to alternative selections until:
 - 1. Student has a schedule similar to original requested hours.

2. All selections have been exhausted.

Alternative selections will not be processed if such action would result in a schedule larger than 18 credit hours or if the alternative selections are already closed.

- G. Students will be placed on waitlists for all requested first choices for which he or she was unable to be enrolled. If a student is placed into a different section of the same course, he or she will be deleted from the wait list. As openings occur the next student on the waitlist will either be notified or automatically enrolled in the course. Departments and instructors reserve the right to sign additional students into closed courses whenever they determine there are unique needs.
- H. Students may change advisors whenever they wish. After conferring with the new advisor and getting the necessary approval for the change, the student must report that agreement to the Registrar's Office. Forms are available at the counter in the Office of the Registrar.
- I. Students are expected to attend class regularly and complete assignments as scheduled. Since many courses have wait lists, it is imperative that professors be aware of your interest and activity in each course. Should you be absent during the first days of a term and you have not provided the instructor with a suitable explanation, it is conceivable that you may be automatically dropped from the course and your spot given to another student.
- J. Since students are expected to attend class regularly and to participate in class discussions, it is appropriate for faculty to include these factors in their grading process. Normally such policies will be included in a syllabus; however, students concerned about this aspect in determining their grades should discuss the matter with the instructor.
- K. Because of the need for better facilities management, more 8:30 and 2:30 classes will be offered. Students closed out of multiple section courses and whose schedules allow them to take an 8:30 or 2:30 section without conflict, may find themselves in these sections in order to reserve a spot for themselves.
- L. Students may repeat courses in order to develop greater mastery of the subject matter. However, second efforts do not erase original efforts. Should students take and successfully complete a course two different times, he/she must be aware that both grades will be included in GPA calculations but the credit hours cannot be included twice. You may wish to discuss all potential ramifications with the Registrar if this scenario is a factor for you. Students wishing to re-enroll for a course for which they have already received a passing mark must receive permission of the chairperson of that department and the instructor of the course to be taken.
- M. If evening courses or courses beginning in the late afternoon need a final examination time, two possibilities exist:
 - I. Once the final class roster can be verified the instructor may ask the Registrar to examine the schedules of the enrolled students and try to find a convenient time for all students fitting the standard 9:00-11:00 or 2:00-4:00 time slots.
 - II. If no other time can be found, the examination will likely be scheduled for an evening 6:30-8:30 p.m. The exam code for such courses will appear (Z) to be arranged.
- N. Students participate in Commencement ONLY AFTER THEY HAVE COMPLETED ALL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS. Students who complete requirements over the summer, or even later, are always eligible to return and participate in the May commencement exercises FOLLOWING their actual completion date.
- O. Falsification or forgery of any College document (e.g., application form, financial-aid form, enrollment form) violates College rules, as outlined in the COURSE OF STUDY under CONDUCT and HONESTY. Suspected violations of this policy are subject to normal judicial procedures.
- P. Adjustments to schedules are possible throughout the pre-registration period. On and after January 18, 2010 all drops and adds must be approved by the academic advisor **and** course instructors. The last day to add courses will be February 1, 2010. Students may drop courses until February 15, 2010.

General Education Requirements

GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS '08 GE (for students who matriculated on or after August 30, 2004)

Students who began a degree program at Denison University prior to August 2004 should speak with the Registrar regarding appropriate courses to fulfill general education requirements.

I. Fine Arts Divisional Requirements (A)

Student must complete two courses with the appropriate "A" designation from Art History (ARTH), Studio Art (ARTS), Cinema (CINE), Dance (DANC), Music (MUS), or Theatre (THTR). A discipline can only be utilized one time for a general education divisional requirement; Art History and Studio Art are parts of the same Art discipline. One Fine Arts Division requirement may be met by an accrued total of 4 semesters of music ensembles, or 4 semesters of music private lessons (same instrument), or 4 credit hours of dance technique work, or 4 credit hours of theatre workshop/practicum.

II. Social Science Divisional Requirements (E)

Registration Information

Student must complete two courses with the appropriate "E" designation from Communication (COMM), Economics (ECON), Education (EDUC), Physical Education (PHED), Political Science (POSC), and Sociology/Anthropology (SA). A discipline can be utilized only one time for general education divisional requirement. Note well that most but not all courses under these rubrics will be used to fulfill social science divisional requirements.

III. Humanities Divisional Requirements (U)

Student must complete two courses with the appropriate "U" designation from Classics (CLCV), English (ENGL), History (HIST), Modern Languages beyond 211 (CHIN, FREN, GERM, JAPN, SPAN), Philosophy (PHIL), or Religion (REL). A discipline can be used only one time for general education divisional requirements. [An appropriate course in modern language may be used in addition to the selections to fulfill the foreign language requirement]

IV. Science Divisional Requirements (Y)

Student must complete two courses with the appropriate "Y" designation from Biology (BIOL), Chemistry (CHEM), Geoscience (GEOS), Mathematics (MATH), Computer Science (CS), Physics and Astronomy (PHYS or ASTR), or Psychology (PSYC). A discipline can be used only one time for general education divisional requirements. [Note well: Math and Computer Science are considered the same discipline for general education as are Physics and Astronomy.] At least one of the courses satisfying the divisional **must have an accompanying laboratory**.

V. Quantitative Requirement (Q)

Student must complete one course with a significant numeracy component with the appropriate "Q" designation. The course could be one of those selections chosen to fulfill a divisional requirement or the Interdisciplinary/World Issues requirement or it may be a separate stand alone experience. Although science and math courses are frequently used to fulfill the Quantitative Requirement, students majoring in Economics, Psychology, Political Science and Sociology/Anthropology will have major requirements that will automatically fulfill this requirement.

VI. Oral Communication Requirement (R)

Student must complete one course with an integral component in oral communication with the "R" designation. This course could be one of those selections chosen to fulfill a divisional requirement or the Interdisciplinary/World Issues requirement or it may be a separate stand alone experience. Students majoring in Modern Languages and Women's Studies might have major requirements that will simultaneously fulfill this requirement.

VII. Writing Requirement (S)

Student must complete FYS 101 or receive a waiver of the writing requirement by means of score of 4 or 5 on an AP English examination or comparable results on some other similar examination.

VIII. Interdisciplinary/World Issues (I)

Student must complete an appropriate course with the appropriate "I" designation from Black Studies (BLST), East Asian Studies (EAST), Environmental Studies (ENVS), International Studies (INTL), Queer Studies (QS), and Women's Studies (WMST). In a few rare instances a course in the divisional sequences might also have an "I" designation.

IX. Foreign Language Requirement (K)

Students fulfilling this requirement with language they had in high school must complete the 211 course in that language. Should a student begin a language for which no high school course work is evident he or she can fulfill the requirement with the 111 -112 elementary language sequence. Please note that the 112 courses do not have the general education code appearing in the column designated '08 GE'. This is because the course is not adequate for every student but depends upon the high school experience.

X. Freshman Seminar

Each Student must complete at least one FYS 102 course or one Honors Seminar. In most cases, this selection will satisfy one of the other requirements listed above and should not constitute an additional course. Note well that FYS 102 or the Honors seminar is a different experience from FYS 101. The writing seminar FYS 101 cannot be used to replace FYS 102 or the Honors seminar.

General Policies and Student Responsibilities

The University reserves the right to withdraw courses with too small enrollment, to change course times if and when necessary, and to offer additional sections and split sections when the advanced registration exceeds expectations. Instructors for courses may also be changed.

Independent Study and Other Special Opportunities

- A. All registrations for directed study (#361), independent study (#363), or senior research (#451, #453) shall be verified by the completion and filing of an appropriate form with the Office of the Registrar. All forms must be signed by the instructor and chairperson and filed in Doane 204 by 4:30 P.M. Friday, September 4, 2009. All students wishing to register for one of these courses will be placed into section 90 until the proper forms are filed with the Office of the Registrar.

Reminder of Faculty Adopted Policies

- A. The payment of full tuition for any semester entitles a regular Denison student to enroll for 18 attempted credit hours for the term. Excess hours beyond 18 will carry a fee of \$1115.00 per hour.
- B. Students failing to pre-register at the appropriate time may be charged a \$10.00 per day late fee. Students may be prohibited from pre-registering if fees or deposits are owed to the University.
- C. Students may elect to contract with an instructor for an additional project and consequently increase the value of a course by one additional credit hour. Forms may be obtained in the Registrar's Office and must be filed by the end of the fifth week of school, February 22, 2010.

- D. Juniors and Seniors may ask to take a course on a "Satisfactory-Unsatisfactory" basis. This is exclusive of courses for which special approval has been given for this form of evaluation. Courses in the student's major/minor fields or to fulfill a General Education requirement may not be taken under this option.
- E. **NOTE WELL:** Students planning to take a course requiring consent need to obtain the written permission of the instructor before submitting the card to the Registrar's Office. Students will not be enrolled in any course until this permission is filed with the Registrar's Office.

Student Responsibility

- A. Courses must be clear of conflict in the weekly schedule. If conflicts are discovered while processing the enrollment card, the second course resulting in the conflict may not necessarily be processed. Instructor approvals of conflicts will be accepted. Ultimately it is the student's responsibility to correct time conflicts.
- B. Note carefully and record accurately the meeting time and section numbers for each course.
- C. Application of general education requirements listed herein must be in accord with the distributive general education program as outlined in the catalog, advice of the academic advisor, and rules and regulations of other university offices and other departments. Ultimately it is the student's responsibility to check and verify the satisfactory completion of all hours, courses, and requirements for graduation.
- D. The student is responsible for making suitable early arrangements for a proper advising session with his or her academic advisor.

Tuition and Fees

- A. Private music lessons will carry an additional charge of \$400.00 per credit hour.
- B. Many studio art courses, cinema courses, and science courses, will have a laboratory fee included with original billings.
- C. Students failing to complete registration by January 19, 2010 may be subject to a late fee of \$10.00.
